Invest in Energy Efficiency

- **Investment in efficiency is roughly 50% less than needed for new infrastructure**
- **Lower energy cost to home or business owners**
- **Greater comfort**
- **Economic development**

- Up to \$100 for qualified ENERGY STAR clothes washers with MEF of 2.0 or higher
- Up to \$50 for qualifying refrigerators (at least 20% better than standard models)
- Refrigerator recycling \$30 incentive plus free pick up

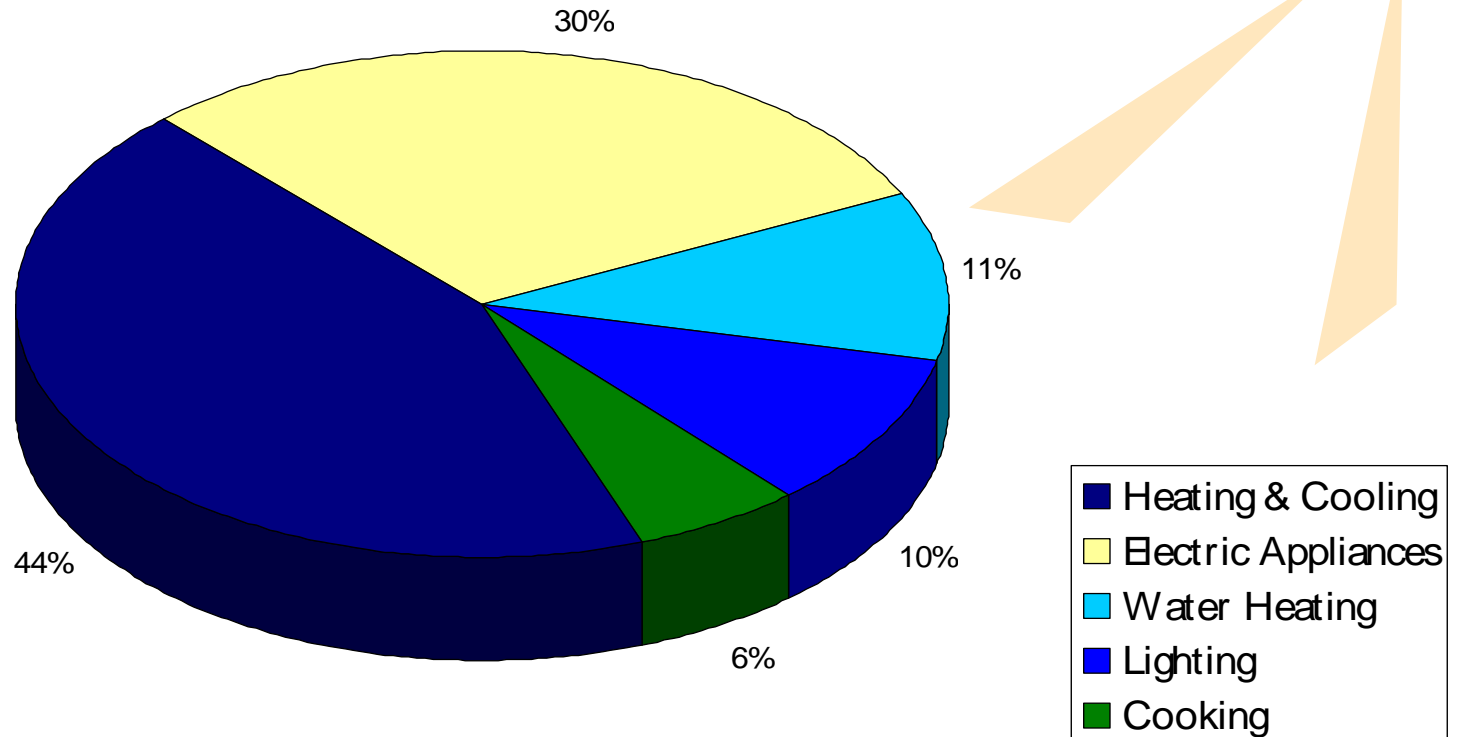

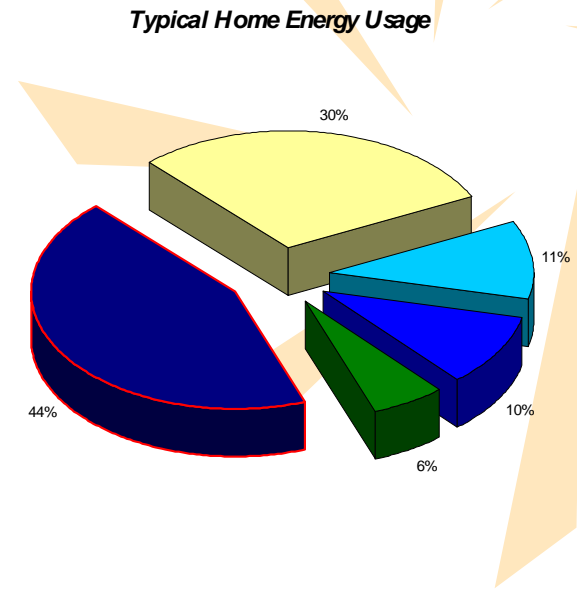
Typical Home Energy Usage



Low Cost Tips

4. Reduce Heating & Cooling Load

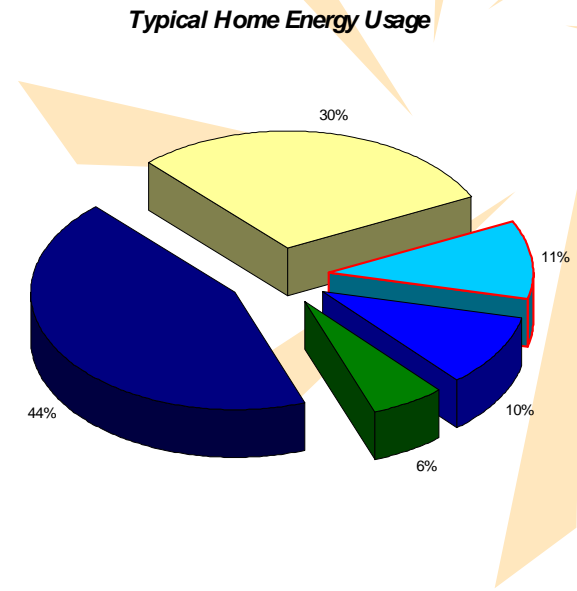
- Clean or change furnace filters regularly
- Schedule annual maintenance
- Caulk and weatherstrip
- Turn down thermostat 10 degrees at night or when you are out
- Consider purchasing a programmable thermostat



Low Cost Tips

5. Reduce Water Heating Load

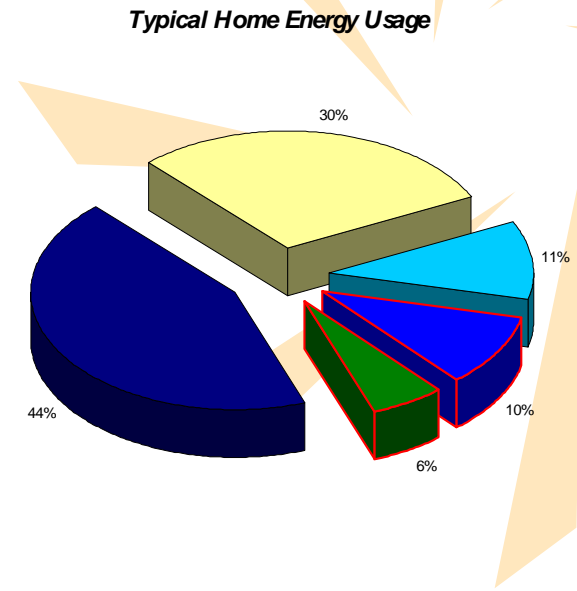
- Turn thermostat down to 120 degrees
- Use cold settings for laundry
- Turn off your water heater while on vacation
- Insulate water pipes
- Install low-flow showerheads



Low Cost Tips

Lighting

- Invest in compact fluorescent lighting (CFLs)
- Use natural lighting where possible
- Turn off unused lights
